

## Gen. Moorman to Assume Commands at Ft. Monmouth

FT. MONMOUTH — An Honor Guard ceremony will be held at 8 a.m. tomorrow in front of Russel Hall here for Maj. Gen. Frank W. Moorman as he assumes command of the U.S. Army Electronics Command (ECOM) and Ft. Monmouth.

Participating units in the ceremony will include the 389th Army Band and the Honor Guard platoon, color guards and bearers of Troop Command, U.S. Army Signal Center and School. The garrison flag will be flown and the state flags will be displayed in Cowan Park.

Gen. Moorman succeeds Brig. Gen. Walter E. Lotz who has been serving as interim commanding officer since the retirement of Maj. Gen. Stuart S. Hoff on July 31. Gen. Lotz is being transferred to Washington.

Since February 1960, Gen. Moorman has been assigned to Supreme Headquarters, Allied Powers, Europe (SHAPE) in Paris, as chief signal officer.

Gen. Moorman was born in Camp Jossam, Philippine Islands in 1912 and was graduated from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1934.

Shortly after the outbreak of World War II, the 82nd Infantry Division was organized and Gen. Moorman was ordered to it as its Signal Officer. He remained with the 82nd Infantry (later Airborne) Division through the campaigns of Sicily, Italy, and Normandy.

In the summer of 1944 he joined the XVIII Corps headquarters as assistant chief of staff G-4, remaining with it throughout the various campaigns in which it participated in Europe.

Gen. Moorman also served with the United Nations Military Staff Committee in New York City and in 1951 had a brief period of service with the Eighth Army staff in Korea.
