

## Woman's Club Welcomes Wife Of CG

FORT MONMOUTH — Mrs. Frank W. Moorman, new honorary president of the Fort Monmouth Woman's Club, was officially welcomed by the club at the membership tea held at Gibbs Hall yesterday.

Mrs. Moorman recently arrived at Fort Monmouth with her husband, Maj. General Moorman, from Paris where the General was Chief Signal Officer of the Supreme Headquarters, Allied Powers, Europe (SHAPE) since February 1960.

Mrs. Moorman is the daughter of Maj. General and Mrs. William Bryden of Washington, D.C.

General Bryden, serving with Field Artillery, was retired from active duty after World War II. Her maternal grandfather was the late Maj. General Thomas H. Barry, who served with Infantry. Her only sister is the wife of Maj. General A. D. Surles, serving with

7th Army in Germany.

Though steeped in Army tradition, with a deep-rooted love for the military environment, Mrs. Moorman's principle activities involve the life and varied interests of the sizable Moorman family, including five sons and a daughter.

Youngest is Ellen, age 8, who with her brother, Michael, age 11, will attend the Rumson Country Day School. Frank, 14, will attend the Ranney School in Rumson; Bill Schoephoester is a student at the University of Arizona; Bob, who has recently completed a three-year tour of duty in the Army in Alaska, is planning to enter Monmouth College this fall; and the oldest son, Lt. Jere Moorman (USAR) will do post-graduate work at the University of Arizona.

Mrs. Moorman attended schools in Washington and Sarah Lawrence College, Bronxville, N. Y.
