Cleavanger Instructor Honors For April

FORT MONMOUTH — SFC Corbly W. Cleavanger Jr., an instructor in the Photographic Division Department of Specialist Training, U.S. Army Signal Center and School, has been selected as the outstanding instructor of the Month for April.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., Cleavanger entered the Army in 1948 and received his training at Fort Dix. He then attended the Photography School at the U.S. Army Pictorial Center, Long Island City, N.Y. He served as a photography instructor there for the next four years.

In subsequent years he has received various assignments as a supervisor of photographic facilities both in the United States

and abroad. The USA EMSA exhibit will be located on Brewer Avenue opposite Theater No. 2.

Military Pay Bill Passes House; Now To Senate

WASHINGTON (AFPS) — The Senate Armed Services Committee, headed by Senator Richard B. Russell (D-Ga.) is now evaluating the Military Pay Bill passed by the House May 8.

Effective date of the pay raise is still likely to be 1 October.

The pay raise would effect 1.8 million servicemen. Not included in the pay raise are those servicemen with less than two years service.

If passed as is by the Senate the pay increases would average 12.6 per cent and would be most substantially hiked for those in the middle grades of both enlisted men and officers. The reasons for heavy increases in these grades is for retention of skilled personnel.

Major Provisions

Major provisions of the House - passed bill would increase the pay of officers and enlisted men to a total of \$847 million annually, and add \$90 million a year to living allowances. Also proposed is an allowance for service personnel who are separated from their families for a long period and who are not housed at govern-

Doctor Hans K. Ziegler Named Chief Scientist Of Electronics Command

FORT MONMOUTH — Dr. Hans K. Ziegler this week was named chief scientist of the U.S. Army Electronics Command here by Maj. Gen. Stuart S. Hoff, Commanding General.

Until his appointment to EC-OM, Dr. Ziegler was the chief scientist for the U.S. Army Electronics Research and Development Agency at Fort Monmouth, a major subordinate of the Electronics Command.

Dr. Ziegler is 52 years of age and lives at 213 Perrine Ave., Elberon. He came to the United States in 1947 from Munich, Germany, where he was born and educated. He holds BS, MS and Ph.D. degrees in electrical engineering from the Technical University of Munich.

The new top scientist for the Electronics Command came to this country under the auspices of Operation Paperclip, and accepted a position with what was then the Army Signal Corps Engineering Laboratory at Fort Monmouth.

Dr. Ziegler has some 29 years of broad professional experience in research and development work in the area of military electronics, obtained in university, private industry, and government assignments. He has been awarded a number of patents, is a productive writer on scientific subjects

and has spoken before many professional and non-professional groups.

The job of chief scientist carries with it prime responsibility for extensive research and development programs for the Electronics Command, which is one of five recently created commodity commands of the Army Materiel Command.
