SUBJECT: Establishment of United States Army Signal Research Unit  
Number 31

TO: Chief Signal Officer

1. a. The United States Army Signal Research Unit No. 31 will be established as a Class II Special Foreign activity, effective 15 November 1957, with an authorized strength of 2 Officers and 3 Enlisted Men.

b. The mailing address of the above unit will be APO 872, New York, New York.

2. Personnel and funds will be furnished from resources available to the Chief Signal Officer.

3. The mission of the United States Army Signal Research Unit No. 31 will be to function as a field agency of a research organization engaged in the study of electromagnetic transmissivity.

4. This unit will be under the operational control of the Chief Signal Officer and attached to the United States Army Garrison, Berlin for administrative and logistical support.

5. The Theater Commander's Inspector General will conduct the Annual General Inspection, less mission, of the United States Army Signal Research Unit No. 31, and will furnish a copy of the report to the Chief Signal Officer.
