ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – “Team CECOM, As a reminder with the upcoming election, although most civilian employees may take part in political activities, the extent and nature of that participation is limited by the Hatch Act and DoD policy. No employees may use their official authority or influence to affect the outcome of an election or to solicit, accept, or receive political contributions. In addition, no employees may engage in political activity while on duty (including teleworking), in the federal workplace, wearing a government uniform or badge, or using a government vehicle.”


CECOM launches software repository for faster, easier cyber patching


APG celebrates Hispanic Heritage with weeklong virtual event
