

2022 C5ISR Hall of Fame Nomination Guidelines

Nominations open 1 November 2021 to 31 January 2022

HALL OF FAME PURPOSE: To recognize and memorialize former members of the C5ISR Community (Community), which includes both Soldiers and civilians from the Communications-Electronics Command (CECOM), Army Contracting Command – Aberdeen Proving Ground (ACC-APG), Combat Capabilities Development Command (CC DEVCOM) C5ISR Center, Program Executive Office Command, Control, Communications – Tactical (PEO C3T), Program Executive Office for Intelligence, Electronic Warfare and Sensors (PEO IEW&S), and the Network Cross-Functional Team (Network CFT) who have made a significant and enduring contribution to the Community and the Army. The organizations listed above share a common heritage and a mission of providing Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Cyber, Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (C5ISR) systems to Soldiers. The C5ISR Hall of Fame expands upon and replaces the CECOM Hall of Fame which was implemented in 2016. The program's intent is preserve the history of the C5ISR Community, and give all members a sense of heritage, honor, pride and belonging.

HALL OF FAME ELIGIBILITY: Membership in the C5ISR Hall of Fame is open to any former Soldier or Department of Army (DA) Civilian assigned to the above listed organizations, whether at headquarters or subordinate organizations. Nominees must be retired or separated from Federal Service for at least four years prior to the opening of the nomination period, including deceased nominees.

HALL OF FAME SELECTION CRITERIA: Nominees will be evaluated on their significant and enduring contributions to the C5ISR Community's historic and ongoing missions. This would include a specific or continuous accomplishment that positively affected a large segment of the Community's employees, customers, and/or vendors. It could also be a long-term contribution that had a lasting and positive impact on mission and/or business practices or had specific benefits to the Community. There must also be explicit evidence that the nominee is held in high esteem by his/her peers, subordinates, and superiors. There should be nothing in the professional or personal background of the nominee to reflect negatively on the Community or the Army. Consideration will be given to the nominee's present position/association with an organization currently doing business with, or seeking to do business with, the Government, and the appearance of and endorsement of that organization should the nominee be selected for the Hall of Fame. Up to five nominees will be selected for inclusion to the C5ISR Hall of Fame each year.

HALL OF FAME NOMINATION: There is no limit to the number of nominations that may be submitted, and any one may submit a nomination. A completed nomination form (see enclosure) must be submitted to the CECOM Historical Office by the closing of the nomination period to be considered. Late or incomplete forms will not be considered.
